What is this product?

- This product is a class of shares of the Sub-Fund and denominated in EUR. The Fund is an investment company with a variable capital and qualifies as a Special Investment Fund ("SIF"), subject to the Luxembourg law of 13 February 2007 related to SIF and as an Alternative Investment Fund ("AIF") subject to the Luxembourg Law of 12 July 2013 related to Alternative Investment Fund Managers ("AIFM") and transposing Directive 2011/61/EC.
- As an investment fund, the return of the Sub-Fund depends on the performance of its underlying assets.

Investment objective:

The Sub-Fund is a feeder fund of "Fimarge Fund – Fimarge International Equity Fund" (the "Master Fund") and invests at least 85% of its total net assets in the Master Fund. The Sub-Fund may invest its remaining assets (i.e. up to 15% of its total net assets) in cash or cash equivalent investments.

Investment policy:

- The Master Fund's net assets will be allocated according to the investment manager's convictions on market evolution, the economic environment, market opportunities etc. and with no restrictions or limits as to geographic, industrial or sectoral diversification.
- The Master Fund will invest up to 100% of its assets in a selected portfolio of international equities (mainly in mid and big capitalisations) traded on organized markets with no geographical constraints, from a purely fundamental analysis for equities. The sub-fund may further invest up to 10% of its assets indirectly through other UCITs, including ETFs.
- Investments in emerging countries will not exceed 30% of the net assets of the Master Fund.
- For liquidity management purposes only, the sub-fund may further invest in short term Investment Grade bonds (mostly Treasuries).
- The Master Fund may hold, on a temporary basis, up to 100% of its assets in cash or money market instruments (i.e. cash and short term deposits, certificates of deposit and bills, money market funds).
- It should be noted that the investment policy of the sub-fund is to invest mainly in shares. Investments in shares or units of UCITS and or other UCI (including ETFs) are allowed within the limit indicated above and that entails a double payment of fees (such as subscriptions and redemptions fees, management fees. . .). The total management fee calculated based on actual management fees costs paid on behalf of fund holdings, may vary up to 2.5% of their respective net assets.
- The Master Fund may not use financial techniques or instruments and will not conclude securities' lending transactions and repurchase agreements except forwards for currency hedging purposes or to adjust the portfolio's currency allocation.

- The Mater Fund may use forwards and futures for hedging purposes in accordance with Chapter IV "Investment Restrictions" described in Part I of the Prospectus.
- While the Mater Fund compares its performance against the 50% MSCI AC World index, 25% Stoxx Europe 600 and 25% S&P500 EUR, the latter is actively managed and does not try to replicate these indices and freely selects the securities that it invests in. This deviation with the reference indices may be significant.
- This financial product does not promote environmental or social characteristics and does not have as its objective a sustainable objective.
- The investments underlying this financial product do not take into account the EU criteria for environmentally sustainable economic activities.
- Given the above investment objective and policy and the risk and reward profile of the product, the recommended holding period is 5 years.

Redemption and dealing: Shareholders may redeem shares on demand, on a daily basis, which is a bank business day in Luxembourg. Distribution policy: Non-distributing shares: any income generated by the Sub-Fund is reinvested.

Intended retail investor

The sale of the shares is reserved to well-informed investors only as defined by article 2 of the 2007 Law. This Sub-Fund may be suitable for investors with medium – high risk tolerance.

The minimum investment is EUR 125,000.

Term

This product was incorporated for an undefined period. It may be terminated by the board of directors unilaterally under the conditions set forth in the offering document of the Fund or by a decision of the general meeting of shareholders.

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 5 years.

The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less.

Performance scenarios

The unfavourable, moderate and favourable scenarios shown are illustrations using the worst, average and best performances of the product over the last 10 years, by identifying, depending on the performance scenarios and as defined in the Key Information Document's EU regulation, all overlapping sub-intervals individually (i) equal in length to the recommended holding period which start or end in each month which are contained within that period of 10 years or (ii) equal or shorter in length to the recommended holding period, but equal to or longer than one year, which end at the end of that period of 10 years. Markets could develop very differently in the future.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended Holding Period ("RHP"): 5 years

The RHP has been defined by taking into account the above investment policy and risk and reward profile. You should be prepared to stay invested for at least 5 years. However, you can redeem your investment without penalty prior to the end of the RHP, or hold the investment longer. Investors may request redemption of shares no later than 12.00 p.m.(noon), Luxembourg time, on the business day preceding the next following valuation day. Redemption requests received after this time and date will take effect on the next following valuation day. Any cashing-in before the end of the RHP may have a negative consequence on your investment.
