

Objectives and Investment Policy

- The investment objective of the Sub-Fund is to achieve a return in excess of cash commensurate with a conservative level of risk.
- The Sub-Fund will invest primarily in units of UCITS and UCIs, and eligible Exchange Traded Funds ("ETFs"), including those managed or distributed by companies in the Andbank Group (collectively "target funds").
- The investment manager intents to invest in emerging markets, through the underlying UCITS, UCIs or ETFs, up to 30% of the portfolio.
- The investment manager will apply an asset allocation methodology on a global multi- asset universe through the selection target funds to obtain a global portfolio with low level of risk and investment horizon between 1 and 3 years. Such methodology stands on three main pillars: global portfolio diversification, long term stable returns and risk control.
- Notwithstanding the above provisions and if justified by the Investment Manager's expectations or exceptional market conditions, the Sub- Fund may invest up to 100% of its net assets in cash and cash equivalents such as (but not limited to) money market instruments, government bonds (and/or money market UCITS/UCI).

- · Unitholders may redeem units on demand, on a daily basis.
- Notwithstanding the above provisions and if justified by the Investment Manager's expectations or exceptional market conditions, the Sub- Fund may invest up to 100% of its net assets in cash and cash equivalents such as (but not limited to) money market instruments, government bonds (and/or money market UCITS/UCI)
- Such UCITS and UCIs will have exposure to a range of asset classes including, but not limited to, equity securities (including small caps), debt securities (including below investment grade debt securities), convertible bonds (excluding contingent convertible bonds "CoCos"), currencies and money market instruments.
- The Sub-fund may also invest through the underlying UCITS, UCIs or ETFs into high yield securities and below investment grade securities limited to an aggregated exposure of 20% of the portfolio.
- The Sub-Fund may use all types of financial derivative instruments.
- · Non-distributing units: any income generated by the sub-fund is reinvested.

Risk and Reward Profile

- The lowest class does not mean that the investment is risk free.
- This fund was categorised in risk class 3 because, in accordance with the investment policy, the value of the investments may fluctuate slightly. Consequently, both the expected return and the potential risk of loss may be moderate. This indicator is based on the historical weekly volatility of Euro Overnight Index Average over the past 5 years and places the sub-fund in this category.

The sub-fund is subject to the following risks:

 Credit and interest rate risks: the value of debt securities may change significantly depending on economic and interest rate conditions as well as the credit worthiness of the issuer.

- Liquidity risk: securities may become less liquid during extreme market conditions and it may be difficult for unitholders to get redemption proceeds in a timely manner.
- Counterparty risk: the Fund is backed by a guarantee from, or has material investment exposure through contracts with, a third party.
- Use of derivatives: derivatives are used to obtain, increase or reduce exposure to underlying assets.
- Currency risk: Investments in securities denominated in currencies other than the Sub-fund's Base Currency may be subject to adverse fluctuation in currency exchange rates.
- Emerging Markets risk: Emerging markets may be subject to increased political, regulatory and economic instability, less developed custody and settlement practices, poor transparency and greater financial risks. As a consequence emerging markets securities may be subject to higher volatility and lower liquidity than non-emerging markets securities.
- Market risk: The value of assets in the Portfolio is typically dictated by a number of factors, including the confidence levels of the market in which they are traded.
- Duplication of certain fees and expenses: when investing in other UCITS and/or other UCIs.
- Management Style Risk: The risks faced by target UCITS and/or UCIs corresponding to their specific management styles may lead to losses.

Charges
